Over 70,000 full text books from scholarly publishers in academic disciplines. Most titles are downloadable to digital devices and accessible by unlimited users. JMU students, faculty, and staff can create ebrary accounts to create bookshelves, highlight and manage notes, export citations, and download full text e-books.

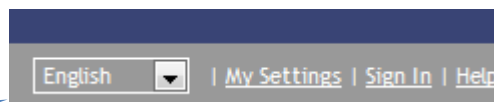

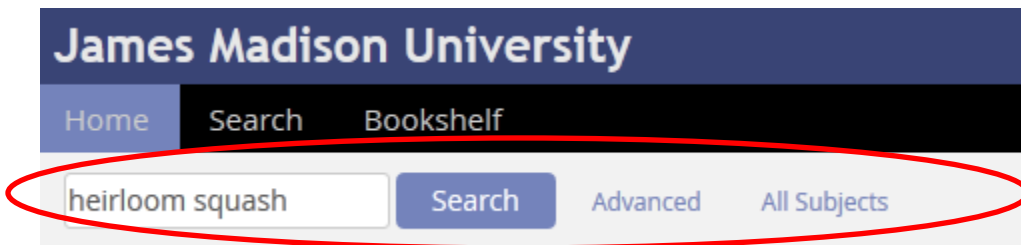

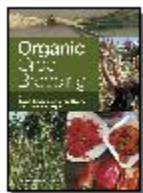

Print pages from ebrary e-books

Most publishers in ebrary allow for a certain percentage of their e-books to be printed. Follow the steps below to print pages to PDF.

**You must be signed into your ebrary account to download or print e-books*

Select the printer icon in the top banner of an ebrary e-book

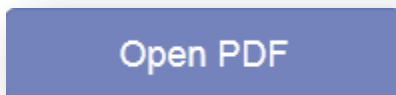

Download ebrary E-Books – PC

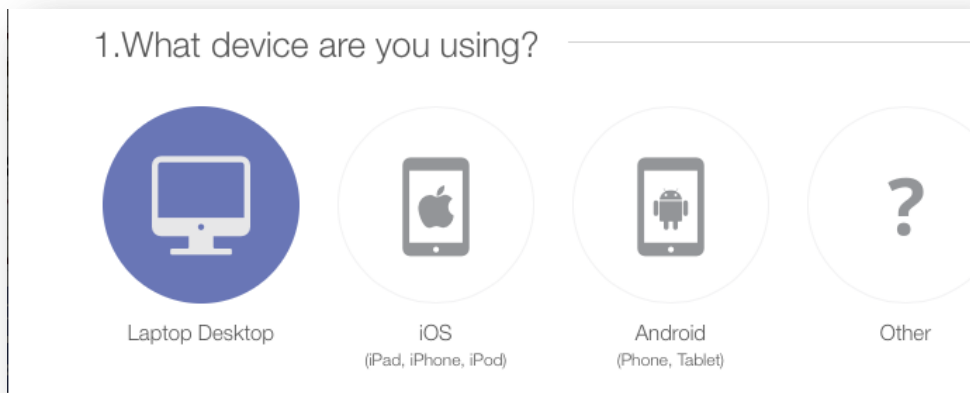
Ebrary e-books can be checked out for 14 days and downloaded to PCs and mobile devices. Don't need the whole e-book?

**You must be signed into your ebrary account to download or print e-books*

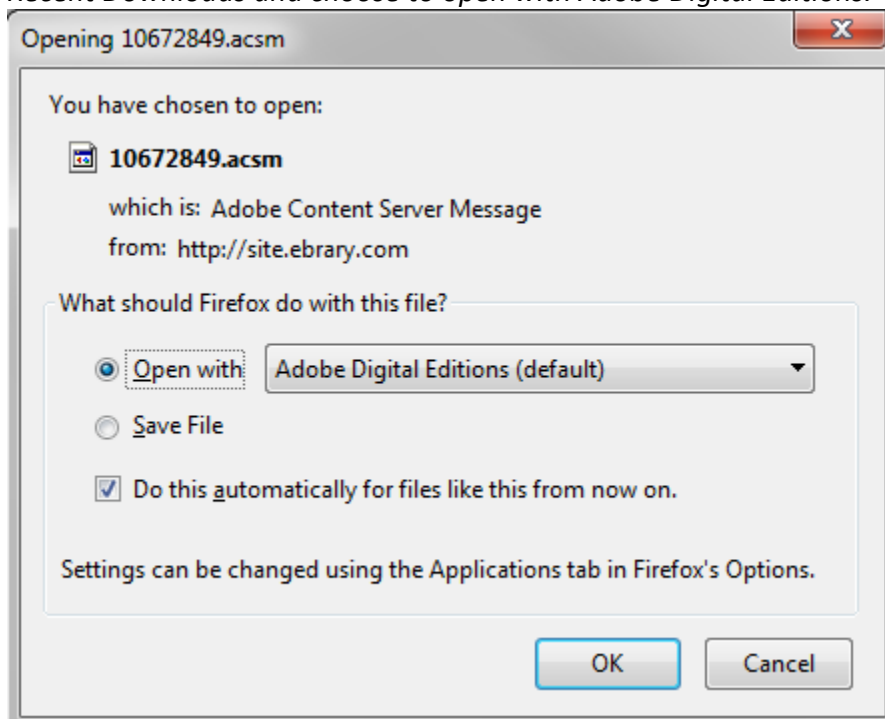
Click the download button next to an ebrary title



Follow the 1-2-3 prompts to select your device, get Adobe Digital Editions, and download your e-book.



**If your e-book does not open automatically in Adobe Digital Editions after downloading, select it from your Recent Downloads and choose to open with Adobe Digital Editions.*

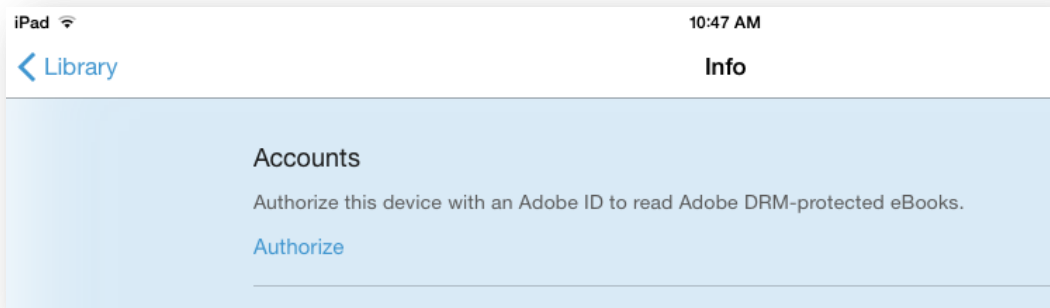


Download ebrary E-Books – Mobile

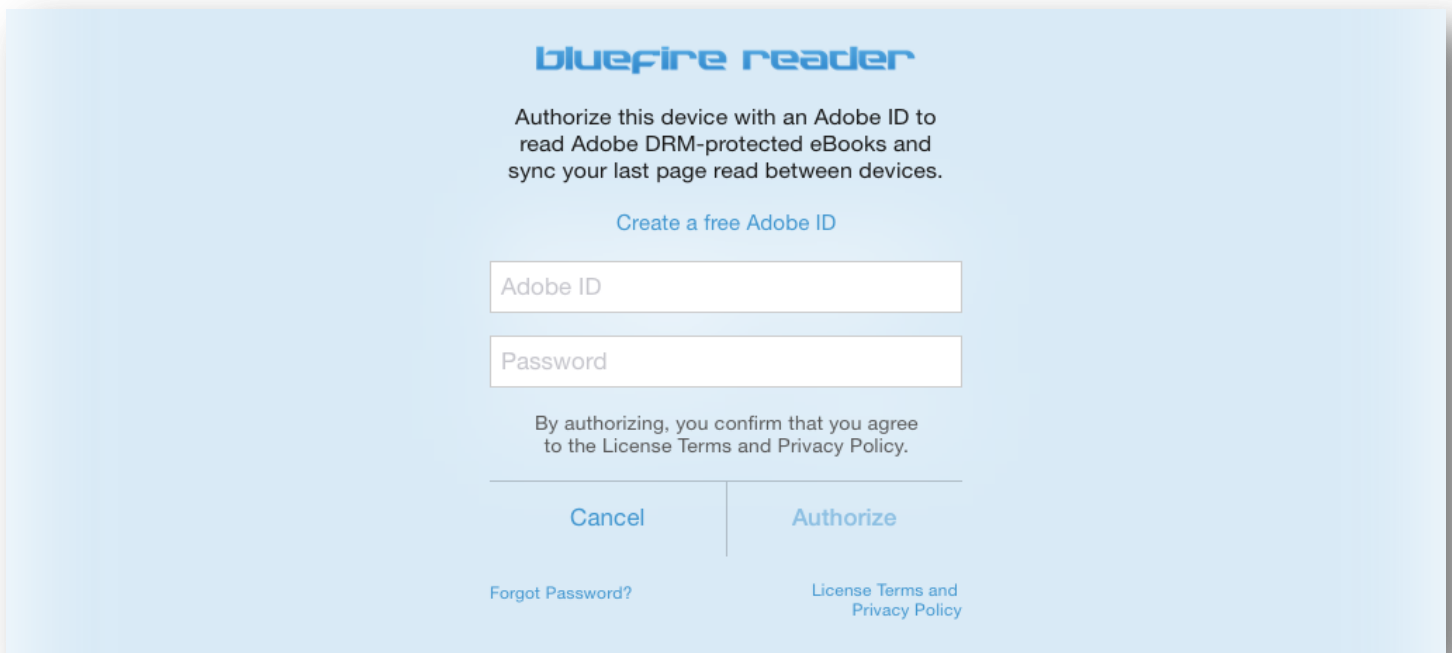
Download the Bluefire Reader app for Android or iOS

Click Accounts → Authorize to authorize the app with your Adobe Digital Editions ID

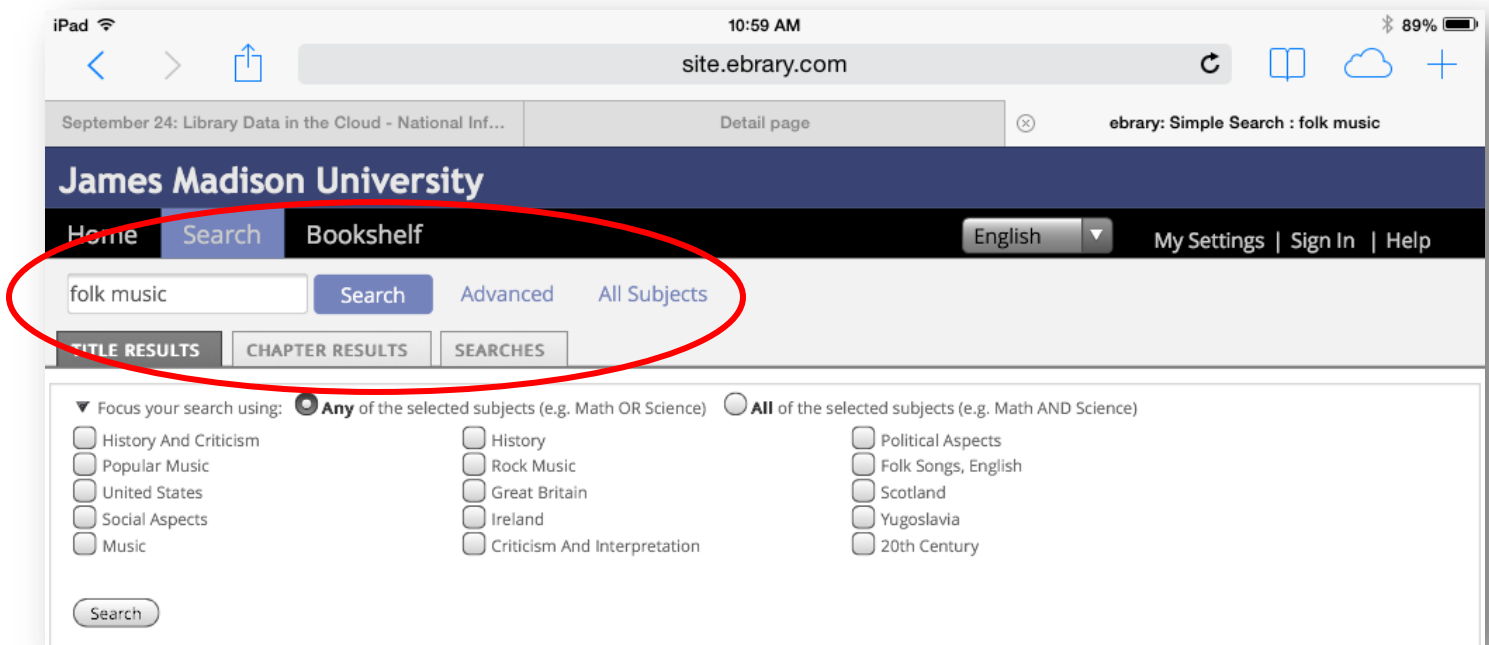

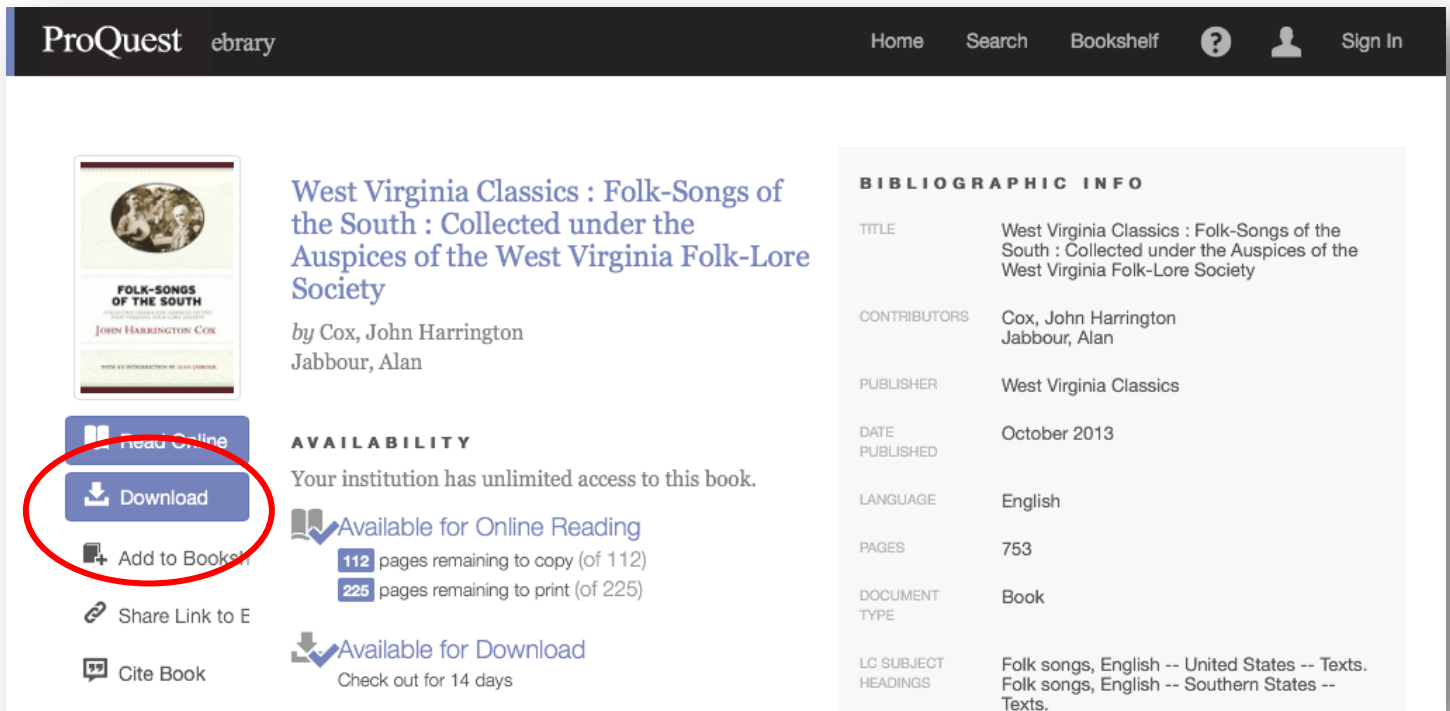
Enter your Adobe Digital Editions username and password when prompted and click Authorize




Search for e-books on the ebrary platform through your mobile device's browser



Select an e-book and click Download to checkout for 14 days





FAQs – ebrary

Can I download an entire e-book?	YES – how to download ebrary e-books
How do I know that I can download a full text e-book?	JMU Library Catalog and QuickSearch records say “Also available for download” and link to “E-book download instructions” directly beneath the full text link.
Do I need special software to download e-books?	YES – Adobe Digital Editions – a free software.
Why do I need Adobe Digital Editions to download e-books?	Adobe Digital Editions manages the loan period and other rights terms set by publishers (DRM). It is installed on all JMU library workstations and linked to from the ebrary catalog resource record.
Loan period	14 days
Can multiple users download the same e-book and/or use it online?	YES – the default is multi-user but some publishers restrict their content to single-user.
Multi-user (MU)	Multiple users can simultaneously read an e-book and download multiple copies.
Single-user (SU)	One user at a time can read an e-book online or download it. E-books return into circulation when online readers navigate away or downloaded e-books expire.
Do all publishers on the platform allow downloading?	Most publishers on the ebrary platform allow multi-user downloading. A few deny downloading outright or restrict their content to single-user only.
Can I download a leased title or does it have to be purchased by JMU?	Does not matter – JMU users can download leased and purchased ebrary titles.
Can I return downloaded e-books?	YES – e-books may be returned anytime during the loan period.

MOBILE & MORE – ebrary

Is there a mobile app?	YES – Use Bluefire Reader for iOS & Android
Can I download e-books from off-campus?	YES – patrons must authenticate as JMU users. Here is more info on connecting to library resources from off campus.
Can I transfer downloaded e-books to mobile devices?	YES – transfer documents from Adobe Digital Editions to supported devices via USB connection.
Can I download e-books directly to mobile devices?	YES – sync the ebrary or Bluefire Reader apps with your Adobe Digital Editions login and download e-books wirelessly.
Can I read downloaded e-books offline?	YES – downloaded e-books are stored locally and not dependent on internet connection for reading.
Can I download e-books to my Kindle, any Kindle?	NO – Adobe Digital Editions does support Kindle devices.
